Background

1. Kalimpong Rotary Learning Commons Project has been allotted to Rotary Club of Kalimpong as Global Grant No 1758729 by The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International for an amount of US\$ 133,833 (INR 88,32,978). Rtn Dr Khem Pradhan Fatimi who originally hails from Kalimpong is the Donor of the Term Gift, in order to fulfil her long cherished desire to give back to her roots an impactful and worthwhile project for the welfare of the Children and Teachers of the area. With Rotary Club of Bellport, RID 7255 as the International Partner and Government Teachers Training Institute, Kalimpong as the Host Cooperating Partner, the project is well nearing completion.

Scope

- 2. The project encompasses the following major objectives which have been completed/ in progress :
- (a). To address community needs and produce sustainable and measurable support activities and training to improve Basic Education and Literacy of children of Kalimpong.
- (b). To provide pedagogic training and teaching skills to Government Primary and Basic School Teachers of Kalimpong District.
- (c). To provide infrastructure to include Digital Library, Audio Visual Room, Books, Computers, E Learning, audio visual equipment, Wifi, and furniture.
- (d). To provide all administrative infrastructure support items to include Security system, upgrade of existing utilities viz, electrical and plumbing, toilets and sanitation system.



Conduct of Teachers Training

- 3. In consonance the aims and objectives of the project, Teachers Training Orientation Courses for 200 Government Primary School Teachers was conducted in 04 Batches of 50 Teachers. The last course ended on 24th Dec '21. The orientation programme was basically targeted towards training the Head Teachers, Assistant Teachers and Teacher in Charge of schools so that they could impart the same training to others in their schools. Government Primary Teachers Training Institute (PTTI), Kalimpong organised the faculty, Resourse persons and conduct of the courses.
- 4. The Teachers Training programme was duly approved by the President of the District School Board, Gorkhaland Territorial Administration, and the District Inspector of Schools (Primary Education). The Assistant Inspector of Schools and Sub Inspectors of Schools of Kalimpong Intensive Circle, Kalimpong General Circle and Gorubathan Circle assisted in identifying and ensuring

attendance by maximum teachers. The training of teachers has also helped Rotary Club of Kalimpong in furtherance of RILM objectives of the first component of TEACH that is Teachers Support.



PROJECT REPORT : ROTARY — DISHA VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE FOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT



1. **Background**. The **DISHA** - Rotary Vocational Training and Skill Development Centre is a joint venture started in 2014-15 with the aim of addressing the community needs of catering for self employment as well as opening avenues to address unemployment amongst local youth of Kalimpong District. Rotary Club of Kalimpong was allotted GG No: 1417493 by Rotary International for an amount of US\$ 69,91(INR 41,94,978) IN 2014-15 for creation of infrastructure, furniture, and purchase of technical equipment for

conduct of the courses. Rotary Club Dunbar, RI District 1020(Scotland) is the International Partner for the project.

2. <u>Affiliation</u>. The Vocational Training and Skill Development Centre is affiliated and is an accredited centre to the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India and LEARNIT (earlier IL&FS) and the National Skill Development Council.

3. <u>Conduct of Courses</u>. The Vocational Training and Skill Development Centre initially started with training in 04 trades namely; Customer Care Executive, Assistant Electrician, Quality



Seed Grower and Dairy Farming & Entrepreneurship. However, over the years additional courses were included like General Duty Assistant (Nursing), Self Employed Tailoring, Beauty & Wellness and Japanese Language.

5. <u>Total Candidates Trained</u>. Till date the Vocational Training and Skill Development Centre has trained the following number of youth in various trades including on going batches:

(a). Tailoring - 25.

(b). General Duty Assistant (Nursing) - 15.

(c). Assistant Electrician - 420.

(d). Customer Care Executive - 325.

(e). Dairy Farming - 410.

(f). Quality Seed Grower - 359

District Governor Visit.** Rtn Dr MS Konwar, District Governor, RID 3240 along with Rtn Prakash Mundra, Assistant Governor, Zone 6 during his official visit to Rotary Club of Kalimpong on 26th Nov 2021, visited the Vocational Training and Skill Development Centre and reviewed the training in progress. The Governor lauded the efforts being put in by Rotary Club of Kalimpong and DISHA and recommended that such projects must also be initiated by other clubs in the District, since the efforts not only addresses the Community Needs but is also relevant in the present day situation of unemployment due to job loss and caters for deficiency of skilled trades in day to day work.

Why CLP?


- 4. Each year Rotary leadership changes at all levels. Rotary leaders are volunteers with many demands on their time.
